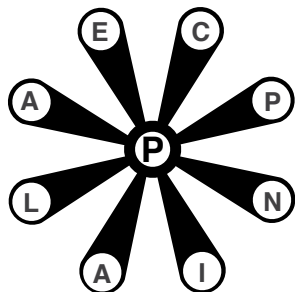
Work out all the missing parts from these book characters' names and find the words hidden in the box of letters. The letters left over will spell out a classic literary duo.

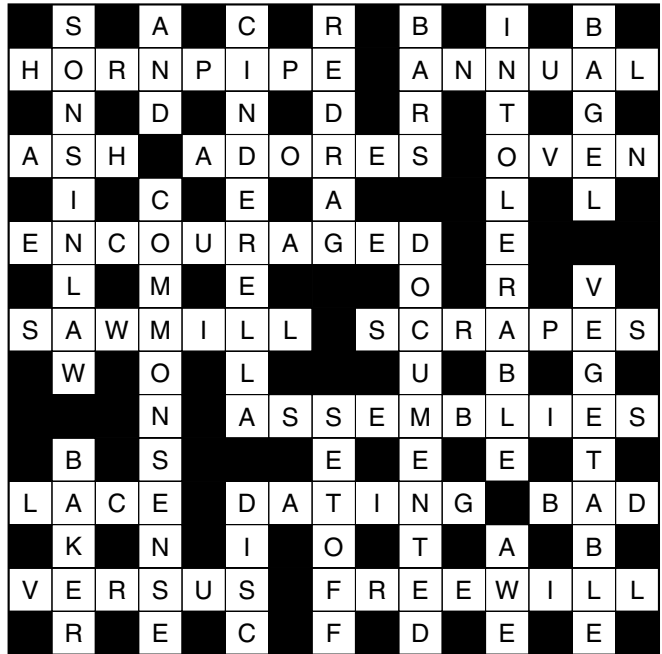
