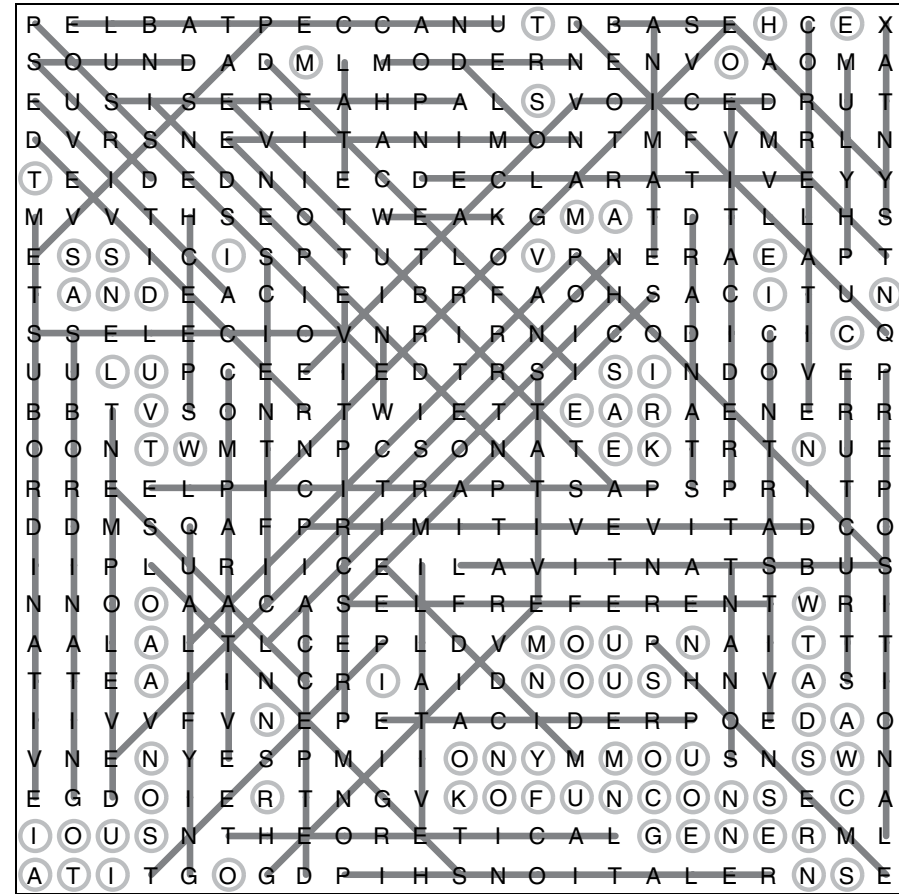


MONSTER FIND-A-WORD LINGUISTICS

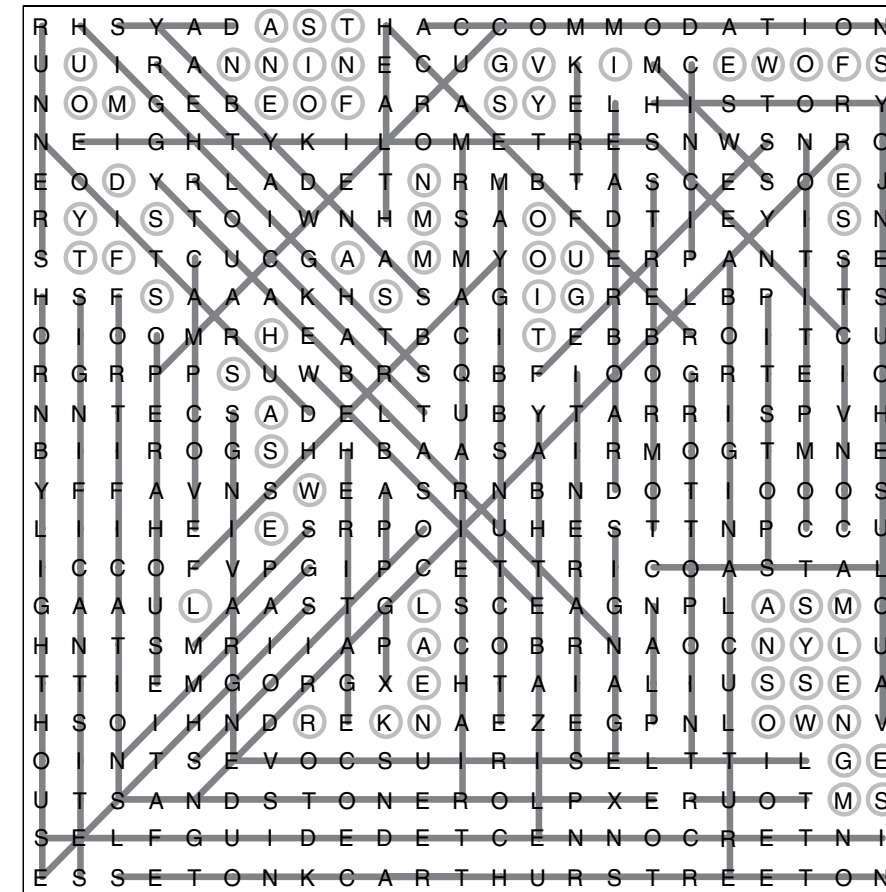
